

If you desire to stop drinking, you have already qualified for membership. Only your donation of a dollar, if you have it, may we suggest. No dues or fees! Our donations go toward rent, literature, coffee and unity in providing informational services and support for the alcoholic.

Alcoholics Anonymous is a "WE"

program "T" couldn't stop drinking, but
"We" could. Each of us in meetings share our
strengths, hope and insight into our own life
condition. We have discovered that we don't
have to do this alone. Spirituality is an
important part of our new life without
drinking. (Note, we are not a religious seed, church or
enity. We are not connected in any manner to the owner
of the buildings in which we meet.)

Each of us have our own program within AA. We elect to have a sponsor of our choosing. We share Tele numbers to gain support and have someone to talk to outside of meetings.
